Senior Resource Design Specialist (secondary focus)

The Centre for Education in Mathematics and Computing (CEMC), based in the Faculty of Mathematics at the University of Waterloo, is Canada's largest and most recognized organization devoted to outreach in mathematics and computer science.

The CEMC invites current and recent secondary school mathematics and computer science teachers to apply for a two-year staff position with the CEMC as Senior Resource Design Specialist. The start date for the position can be between 01 June 2024 and 01 August 2024. The position is a year-round position. Weekly hours can be negotiated between 4 days and 5 days per week. The expected starting annual salary for full-time hours is between \$76 500 and \$95 600.

This formal job description captures a large set of accountabilities and duties that might be included in the position over time. The initial main duties of this particular position would be:

- conducting problem solving workshops for students in Grades 7 to 12 at schools in Ontario and internationally,
- co-leadership of the Mathematics stream of the CEMC's annual Summer Conference for Educators, and
- co-leadership of the CEMC's Problem of the Week, which includes mathematical, pedagogical, technical, and administrative aspects,

along with performing other duties as assigned by the Director of the CEMC.

The successful candidate will normally be expected to work on campus in Waterloo at least three days per week.

When submitting an application, please ensure that your cover letter includes information about alignment of interests, abilities and experience with the CEMC's mission and priorities.
